**EOC Activation Level:** The EOC began operating at Level 1 at 2pm on Tuesday March 3, 2020. This level is intended to cover the period before an emergency where there is forewarning of an impending situation that can be monitored to evaluate conditions as they emerge, grow, or dissipate. During this period a daily Situation Report will be sent out to EOC Staff **before 1pm** each day Monday - Friday.
