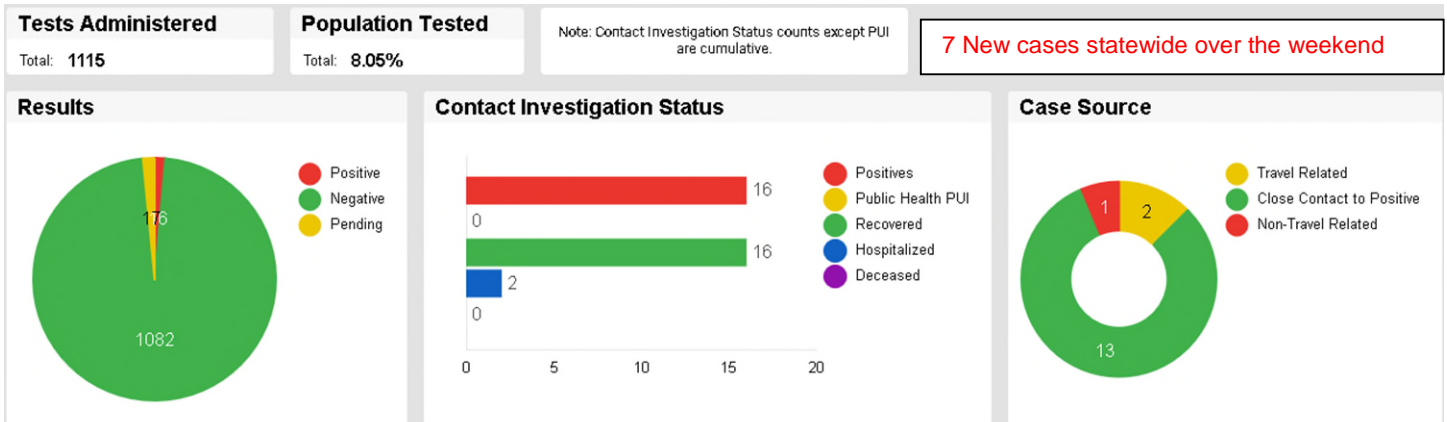

## COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- The EOC is fully staffed and is preparing for recovery efforts while remaining vigilant and enhancing preparedness.

- Phases 3 and 4 of the Reopening Alaska Responsibly Plan details are posted at <https://covid19.alaska.gov/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/05212020-Phase-III-IV-Guidance.pdf>
- Plans for establishing additional Points of Distribution (PODs) for COVID-19 related vaccines and treatments are underway.

## Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. The hotline has taken 219 (+6) calls with 44 (+1) testing referrals.
- Wastewater testing for COVID-19 continues. First sample results are expected soon, and a second lab has been identified; results will be shared with Alaska DEC when received.
- Peace Health is using QIAGEN and Abbott ID Now testing in house; effort to secure consistent reagent supply continues.
- All hand sanitizer refill stations have been established and are being maintained.
- **Of the 211 test performed at the drive-up clinics over the past 2 weeks, all results have been received and are negative.**
- Preparations finalized to continue drive up COVID-19 testing for Wednesday and Thursday.

## Planning

- Recovery unit leader is coordinating with economic sector representatives to determine the scope and types of needs arising from COVID-19 related business closures. The information will be provided to the Policy Group for direction.
- Norwegian, Oceania, Royal Caribbean, and Celebrity have suspended sailings to Alaska through end of July.

## Logistics

- Received 15,000 surgical masks, and 5,000 N-95 masks. Brings totals to 53,932 surgical masks and 5929 N-95 masks.
- **8 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 1 Abbot ID Now; Legacy Health Clinic 1 Abbot ID Now, 2 outside testing companies.**
- A second shipment containing additional isolation gowns and 500 swabs has been received from the SEOC.
- **8 non-contact thermometers have been received from the TEOC.**
- Testing supplies:

\*This is the total number of test kits available both as complete kits, and as a combination of components.

## Finance

- PROC secured a source of test kits that will resupply in batches of 100 as needed, and is researching sources of bulk PPE.
- PROC secured dedicated processing of test specimens at the Seattle lab facility as well as an allocation of Priority 1 labels.

## PIO

- Continues to release multiple social media updates throughout the day (**May 27-28 Drive-Up Testing Clinic; Daily Case Count and Testing Update**).
- **Drafted newspaper display ad for Drive-Up Testing Clinic.**
- Continues to broadcast PSA's on local radio and television.
- Medical supply donations can be dropped off at Saxman Community Center uphill side from 9am to 4pm Mon-Fri.

## LIAISON

- In concert with other officials, reviewed senior parents' graduation parade plan, will provide recommendation to UC.
- Continues to investigate complaints and respond to questions.
