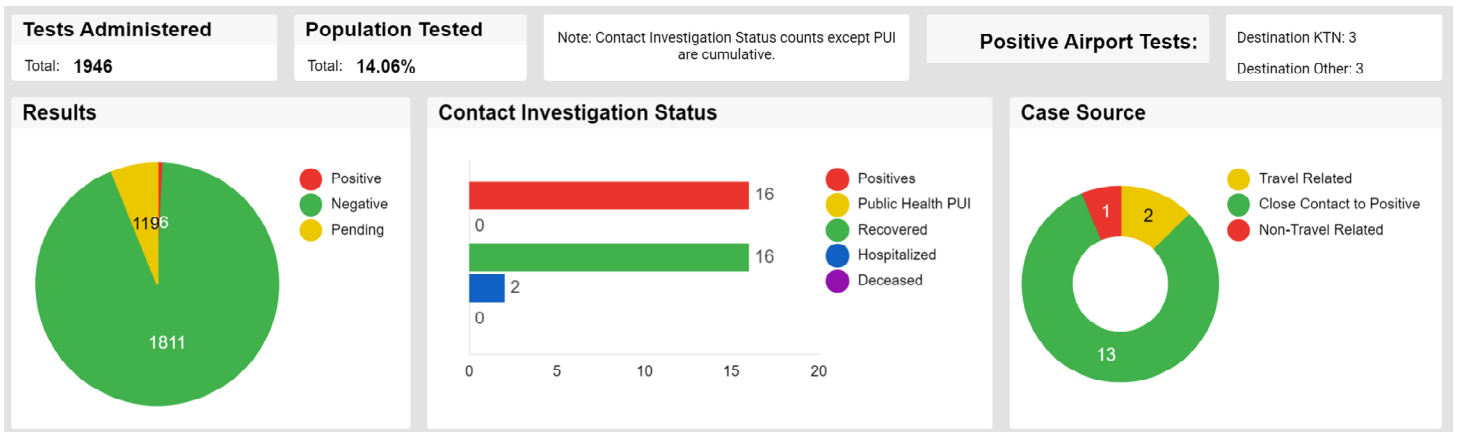

COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- Website dashboard and test result image above will be updated next week to better display data.
- The EOC is fully staffed and is preparing for recovery efforts while remaining vigilant and enhancing preparedness.
- Per the State of Alaska, a suggested target of 2% of the population should be tested per month. The Current EOC testing tactic calls for 100 tests per week which is 2.88% of the population.
- New IAP approved for the Operational Period beginning today.
- Additional changes to State Mandate 10.1 and are posted at <http://covid19.alaska.gov/travelers>.

Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. The hotline has taken 436 (+77) calls with 55 testing referrals.
- The third wastewater sample results have been received and were also negative for COVID-19 in the City of Ketchikan wastewater stream; the results are being shared with Alaska DEC. Researching the threshold at which the test is accurate.
- Peace Health is using QIAGEN, CEPHEID and Abbott ID Now testing machines.
- Ordered-Remdisivir and received 1500 Cepheid tests from the SEOC in support of Mandate 17 testing.
- Continue to determine provider supply needs and submit 213RR through SEOC for Abbot testing supplies.
- Assisted KIC with preparations for drive –up testing clinic on 6/6.
- Established, operating, and refining testing facilities for out of state travelers arriving at the airport.
 - 298 travelers have been tested resulting in 6 positive cases being identified.
- Drive up testing efforts have been successful and will continue each week on Wed and Thurs from 11am to 1pm
 - This week's drive up testing clinic collected 64 samples on Wednesday and 29 on Thursday for a total of 93.
 - Preparations are underway to conduct the operation without the assistance of Public Health as their available time decreases due to increased contact investigations.

Logistics

- 8 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 1 Abbot ID Now; Power of Wellness 1 Abbot ID Now, 2 outside testing companies.
- Rec'd 1500: 3D swabs, Saline solution, Cepheid test kits, and 3 boxes of VTM from State Virology lab.
- Testing supplies:

Finance

- Finalized MOU with the State for local testing of arriving passengers at the airport.
- Continued work on wide variety of contracts needed for the airport testing operation.

PIO

- Continues to release an average of two social media updates throughout the day as well as case and testing counts.
- Focus has been on CARES Act funding, airport testing including providing forms and other supplies, and new cases.
- Drafted new PSA's to be recorded by the mayors, placed signs at ballfields
- Medical supply donations can be dropped off at Saxman Community Center uphill side from 9am to 4pm Mon-Fri.
