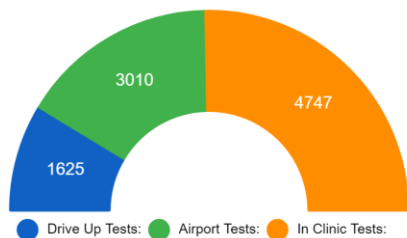

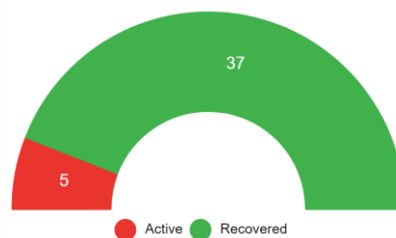

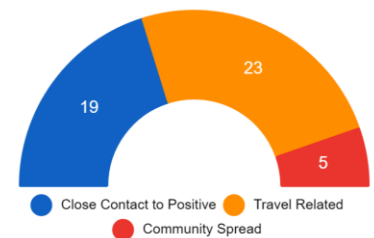
Tests by Collection Location

COVID-19 Unified Command Objectives:

- Safeguard health & safety of personnel and the public
- Prevent, Contain, and Stop the spread of COVID-19
- Expand local COVID-19 testing capacity
- Support care for the sick
- Provide public information
- Develop both Open and Closed Point of Dispensing (POD) Plans
- Determine future funding sources or constraints as emergency declarations and Federal funding **options sunset.**

COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- The EOC is fully staffed and is preparing for recovery efforts while remaining vigilant and enhancing preparedness.
- **New IAP approved for the Operational Period beginning today.**
- Created draft Community Risk Indicators - Risk Levels – Mitigation Measures document that is being coordinated for stakeholder input. Available for public review at <https://tinyurl.com/ktn-covid-risk>

Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. Calls received: **1,225 (+68)** Testing referrals: **187 (+21)**
- The **10th and 11th** wastewater sample results have been received and were also negative for COVID-19 in the City of Ketchikan wastewater stream; the results are being shared with Alaska DEC. Researching the threshold at which the test is accurate.
 - Evaluating efficacy of the program because of the three week lag time in receiving sample results.
- Continue to determine provider supply needs and submit 213RR-for DNA Away cleaner.
- Established, operating, and refining testing facilities for out of state travelers arriving at the airport.
 - **9,312** travelers have been screened resulting in **14** positive cases being identified since the start of the program. On average, 200 travelers are screened daily.
- Drive up testing efforts have been successful and will continue each week on Wed and Thurs from 11am to 1pm
 - **This week's drive up testing clinic collected 49 samples.**
 - Working with AMHS to establish regular testing schedule **and alternate testing location for crew who cannot make regular testing event. Collected 21 samples on 7/30.**
 - Making final preparations to begin testing of Island Air Express passengers at the airport terminal.
- Completed July 22nd testing event in Saxman with assistance from KIC. 14 samples collected
- **Finalizing warehouse benchmark levels for a one-month operating supply of PPE to support all local providers if needed.**
- **Coordinating with fish processors to establish a surveillance testing program.**

Logistics

- 9 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 2 Abbot ID Now; Power of Wellness 1 Abbot ID Now, 2 outside testing companies.
- **Established protocols for distributing cloth masks and handed out 6,500 to date and continues to distribute other supplies as needed.**
- Testing supplies:

Finance

- Reported on and monitored changes to FEMA procurement guidance and federal disaster declaration.
- Calculated cost of COVID-19 response to City of Ketchikan at \$1.2 million as of July 15. Expect about \$800,000 to be reimbursed through FEMA or CARES Act.
- **Working on distribution of CARES Act funding.**
