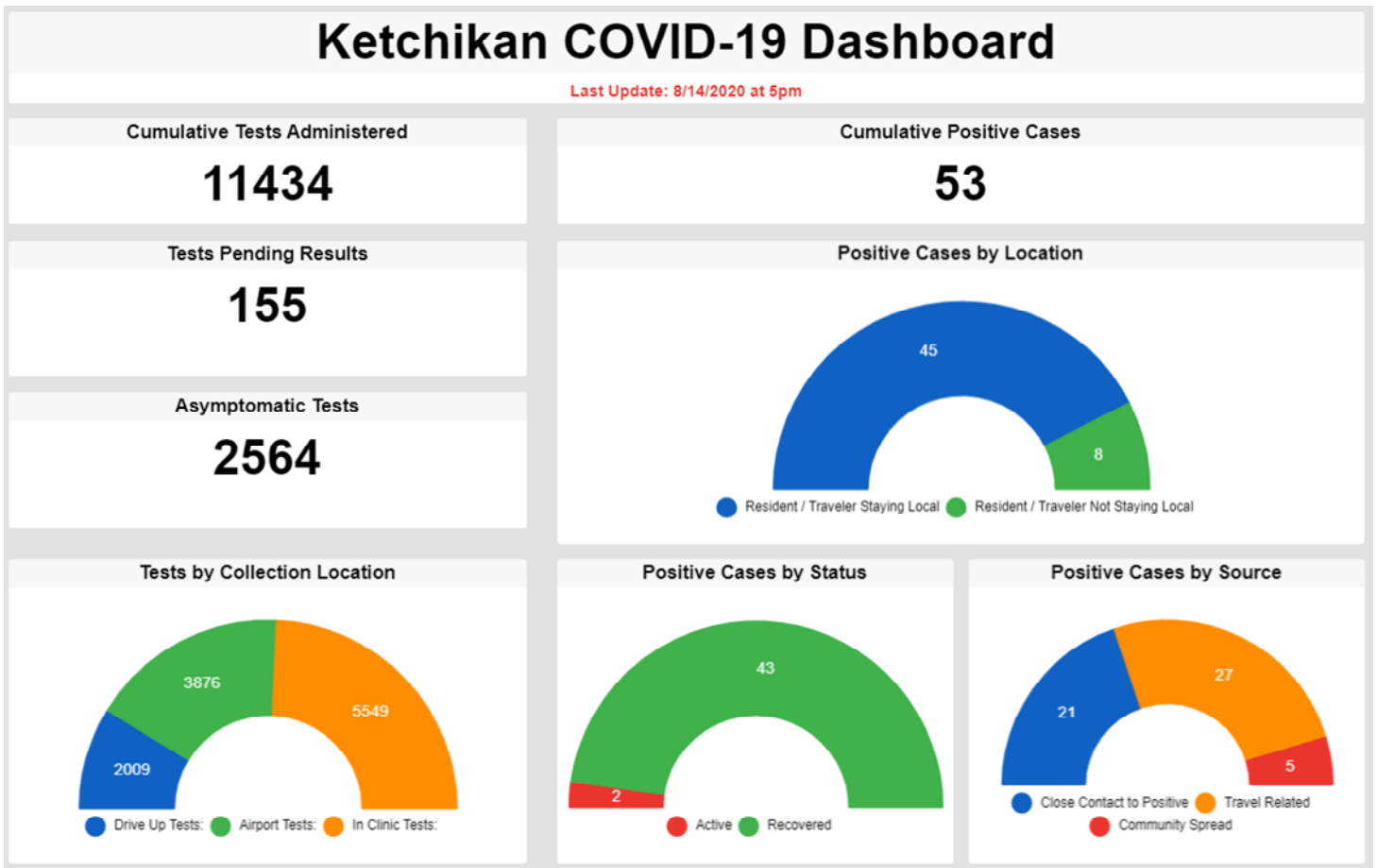

### COVID-19 Unified Command Objectives:

- Safeguard health & safety of personnel and the public
- Prevent, Contain, and Stop the spread of COVID-19
- Expand local COVID-19 testing capacity
- Support care for the sick
- Provide public information
- Develop both Open and Closed Point of Dispensing (POD) Plans
- Determine future funding sources or constraints as emergency declarations and Federal funding options sunset.

## COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- New IAP approved for the Operational Period beginning today.
- Created draft Community Risk Indicators - Risk Levels – Mitigation Measures information is now included on the dashboard located at <https://kgbak.us/covid19> and included them in daily test and case count updates.

## Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. Calls received: 1,400 (+22) Testing referrals: 257
- Continued wastewater testing and hand sanitizer distribution programs. Two more results returned as non-detect.
- 10,960 travelers have been screened resulting in 16 positive cases being identified since the start of the traveler testing op. These number have not changed on the smart sheet with the operations testing data. Am I looking in the wrong place?
- Drive up testing efforts have been successful and will continue each week on Wed and Thurs from 11am to 1pm
  - Samples collected; 39 drive-up, 18 AMHS, and Power of Wellness to be AMHS alternate testing location.
- Finalized list for one-month supply of PPE. Working on a program to maintain that supply in reserve.
- Coordinating with fish processors to establish a surveillance testing program.
- Reviewed revisions to Health Mandate 10 and began adapting operation for using State online Portal.
- Reviewed local testing options to decrease turn-around time for the drive up testing operation.
- Relocated traveler testing site to the airport and revised drive-up testing hours to accommodate voucher testing.
- Designing a more weather resistant facility for drive-up testing during the winter months.
- Working toward Traveler Testing Portal for testing documentation.

## Logistics

- 9 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 2 Abbot ID Now; Power of Wellness 1 Abbot ID Now, 2 outside testing companies.
- Established protocols for distributing cloth masks, to date Logistics has delivered 24,000 masks to various agencies and organizations.
- Testing supplies:

## Finance

- Testing IFB is under review with FEMA and once approved, must go out for 21 day advertising period. IFB process does not stop current operations - is forward-looking and proactive and improves compliance with Federal guidelines.
- Finance & Procurement continue to work on IFB/RFP related to testing, and to coordinate w/DHSS & FEMA to confirm procurement, contracting, and billing compliance.
- Reported that FEMA prefers costs not be split between jurisdictions.
