COVID-19 Unified Command Objectives:

- Safeguard health & safety of personnel and the public
- Prevent, Contain, and Stop the spread of COVID-19
- Expand local COVID-19 testing capacity
- Support care for the sick
- Provide public information
- Develop both Open and Closed Point of Dispensing (POD) Plans
- Determine future funding sources or constraints as emergency declarations and Federal funding options sunset.

COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- New IAP approved for the Operational Period beginning today.
- Created draft Community Risk Indicators - Risk Levels – Mitigation Measures information is now included on the dashboard located at <https://kgbak.us/covid19> and included them in daily test and case count updates.
- A new saliva based test has been approved by the FDA – Staff beginning to research feasibility of use in KTN
- With no new community transmission cases, Community Risk level has been decreased to Level 1 – Low
- Working with Public Health to hold open Point of Dispensing (POD) for regular Flu vaccine planned for October 17.

Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. Calls received: 1,526 (+46) Testing referrals: 310 (+32)
- Continued wastewater testing and hand sanitizer distribution programs.–Evaluating the value of continuing the wastewater testing operation. Received a non-detect result from 8/13 sample.
- 11,870 travelers have been screened resulting in 18 positive cases being identified since the start of the traveler testing op.
- Drive up hours have been expanded to 9:30 to 11:30 am and 2:30 to 4:30 pm Tuesday through Saturday weekly at Berth 3.
 - Samples collected; 35 drive-up and 25 AMHS. Travel voucher testing is also available at the drive-up site.
- Finalized list for one-month supply of PPE. Working on a program to maintain that supply in reserve.
- Coordinating with fish processors to establish a surveillance testing program.
- Reviewed revisions to Health Mandate 10 and began adapting operation for using State online Portal.
- Relocated traveler testing site to the airport and revised drive-up testing hours to accommodate voucher testing.
- Finalizing design of a more weather resistant facility for drive-up testing during the winter months.
- Working toward Traveler Testing Portal for testing documentation, and making other refinements to testing operations.
- Completed and distributed inventory of health care resources available locally.

Logistics

- 11 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 2 Abbot ID Now & 1 Luminex ; Power of Wellness 1 Abbot ID Now, Creekside 1 BioFire, 2 outside testing companies.
- Distributed 30,000 masks, other PPE, and testing supplies. Also identified a new source and ordered more supplies.
- Secured a new source for Abbot ID testing supplies and received 15 cases of same.
- Testing supplies:

Finance

- Developed an MOU between KIC clinic and COK for operation of the Luminex testing equipment.
- Verified that the BIOFIRE testing machine can be used for drive-up testing and modified the MOU to include it.
- Developed Invitation For Bids (IFB) for community testing services to meet federal procurement guidelines.
