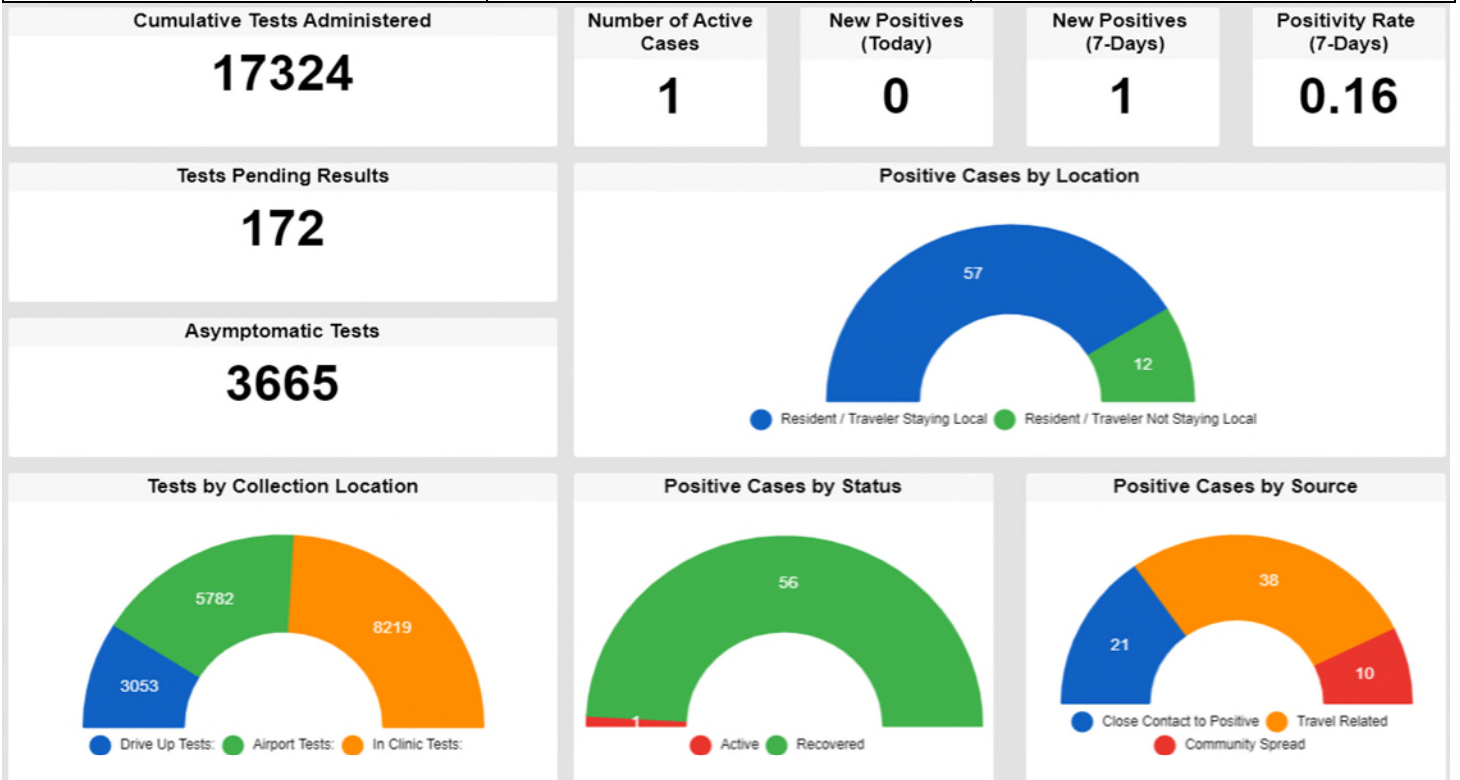

COVID-19 Unified Command Objectives:

- Safeguard health & safety of personnel and the public
- Prevent, Contain, and Stop the spread of COVID-19
- Support care for the sick
- Provide public information
- Determine future funding sources or constraints as emergency declarations and Federal funding options sunset.
- Develop both Open and Closed Point of Dispensing (POD) Plans

COVID-19 Ketchikan EOC Actions:

- **New IAP approved for the Operational Period beginning today.**
- Community Risk Indicators - Risk Levels – Mitigation Measures information is now included on the dashboard located at <https://kgbak.us/covid19> and included in daily test and case count updates.
- A new saliva based test has been approved by the FDA – Staff continues to research feasibility of use in KTN
- Public Health to hold open Point of Dispensing for regular flu vaccine on October 17 at K-Hi. 400 doses available.
- A plan is being developed for the distribution of a Covid-19 vaccine which is anticipated in late October at the earliest.
- Modifications to Health Mandate 10, Appendix 1 is expected soon. Surveillance testing of seafood workers is expected to be required.
- Initiated planning for Halloween festivity safety.
- Volunteer survey for POD volunteers has been completed.

Operations

- The testing hotline number 907-247-TEST (8378) is available M-F 8am – 6pm, Sat 10am – 4pm, and closed on Sunday to screen and refer symptomatic individuals for testing. **Calls received: 1,768 (+26)** Testing referrals: 375
- Continued hand sanitizer and cloth mask distribution programs.
- **18,375** travelers have been screened resulting in **22** positive cases being identified since the start of the traveler testing op.
- Drive up hours have been expanded to 9:30 to 11:30 am and 2:30 to 4:30 pm Tuesday through Saturday weekly at Berth 3.
 - **Samples collected; 0 drive-up, 14 traveler, and 19 AMHS.** Travel voucher testing is also available at the drive-up site.
- Finalized power supply to new drive-up testing shelter and lights at the airport testing site.
- Working toward Traveler Testing Portal for testing documentation and making other refinements to testing operations.

Logistics

- 11 testing machines on Island: Peace Health 4 Abbot ID Now, 1 QIAGEN & 1 Cepheid, KIC 2 Abbot ID Now & 1 Luminex ; Power of Wellness 1 Abbot ID Now, Creekside 1 BioFire, 2 outside testing companies.
- Continues to deliver masks to various agencies and testing supplies to Power of Wellness and long term care.
- Cancelled order of 24,500 N-95 masks due to long response time. Alternate suppliers are being evaluated.
- **Wrote a report for the Finance Section regarding the dispersal of PPE purchased from Medlogic.**
- Testing supplies:

- Reported that end to current Health Emergency extensions last 90 days and the current one will expire on October 25.
