There was one new case of Covid-19 identified in Ketchikan today. This was a symptomatic person from Kayhi, who was tested as a close contact to other recent positives. This case, as well as the other twelve (12) that were under investigation yesterday have all been determined to be close contact and are part of the single large cluster of new cases. As a result, the community risk level has not been raised.

This individual has been notified of the positive test result, has been directed to isolate, and is being monitored by healthcare providers. Public Health has begun the contact investigation and will be in touch with anyone who may have been in close contact with this person.

Due to the high number of potential contacts to the new positive, Public Health and the School District are working together to reach out to those affected. According to Superintendent Beth Lougee, Kayhi will be closed tomorrow November 2, 2020 for all students and staff, including the Kayhi Preschool and after school activities. What if you were in contact with a known positive?

If you are being tested because of symptoms or a close contact:

- Stay at home until your test results are back (except to get medical care).
- Avoid all public places and transportation.
- Keep at least 6 feet from people and animals, including those in your household.
- Avoid sharing personal household items, wash your hands and high touch surfaces regularly.
- Inform your work, (or your child's school) that you are awaiting results.

What if your result is positive?

Most people do well, but it is important to take care of your health and protect those around you

- Stay at home and avoid all public places and transportation until cleared by public health from isolation (except to get medical care).
- Keep at least 6 feet from people and animals, including those in your household.
- Avoid sharing personal household items (including the restroom), wash your hands and high touch surfaces regularly. • Inform your work (or your child's school) that you are positive.
- Wear a face covering if your symptoms allow, even in the house when not in a separate bedroom.
- Designate one household member to bring you food and other necessities.
- If you need non-medical help (e.g., groceries or other support) call 2-1-1 or 1-800-478-2221.
- Notify your close contacts (i.e., anyone who was within 6 feet of you for 15 minutes or longer during the two days prior to when your symptoms started, or when you were tested, whichever is earlier) that they need to quarantine for 14 days from the time you were last together.

If you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop any symptoms, no matter how minor—such as a fever, cough, difficulty breathing, headache, or body ache—call your healthcare provider for medical advice or use the Testing Hotline and call 247-TEST (8378). Today's case brings the cumulative Covid-19 case count, including travelers, to 109. The number of positive cases of individuals residing or staying in Ketchikan is 97. Of the 97 cases, 25 are still active, and 72 have recovered. Despite these new cases the community risk level remains at "Level 2 - Moderate".
