There were twelve (12) new Covid-19 cases reported in Ketchikan today. Eleven (11) of the positive individuals were determined to be close contacts of known positive(s), and one was determined to be community spread. Of the 12, eight are symptomatic, and four are asymptomatic. Five of the 12 cases are members of the same household. There were no new hospitalizations reported today.

Of the cases announced on November 6 that were under investigation, all seven were determined to be close contacts to a known positive.

The newly identified positives have been notified of the positive test results, have been directed to isolate, and are being monitored by healthcare providers. Public Health has begun the contact investigations and will be in touch with anyone who may have been in close contact with these individuals; however, Public Health is also asking certain individuals to reach out to their own close contacts and advise them to quarantine for 14 days. This has become necessary since the Health Department's caseload has increased substantially in the last week.

Today's case brings the cumulative Covid-19 case count, including travelers, to 161. The number of positive cases of individuals residing or staying in Ketchikan is 149. Of the 149 cases, 67 are still active, and 82 have recovered.

Although we continue to have positive cases, the Community Risk level is remaining at Level 3-High, and is **not** being raised to Level 4-Very High due to the following factors:


1. The community has responded to the Level 3 risk mitigation measures with individuals and businesses taking actions to help to reduce the infection rate. Many businesses have reduced their capacity and have required masks to be worn.
2. Of the recent positive cases, 52 are tied to one outbreak cluster.
3. The rate of the community spread cases continues to stabilize.
4. We increased to Level 3 on November 4th, and by allowing the Level 3 mitigation measures to have an impact on the cases, we are hopeful that we will see the positive case numbers begin to decline.

We continue to urge all citizens to follow the recommended mitigation measures in order to stay in Risk Level 3 and not increase to the next level.

Recommended Mitigation Measures:

- Strongly recommend masks and social distancing be enforced in communal settings and public locations with 5 or more people. If six-foot distancing is not possible, then mask should be worn.
- Strongly recommend businesses encourage telework to the maximum extent possible, reduce capacity to ensure physical distancing can be maintained not to exceed 50% capacity; close shared spaces such as break rooms, kitchens, etc.
- Strongly recommend bars closed, restaurants reduce capacity to 50% and ensure physical distancing with reservations required. Delivery or curbside pick encouraged.
- Personal services (nail and hair salons, massages, etc.) appointments only with one customer per each service provider. No waiting areas.
- Gyms-no group activities and limit capacity to 25%.
- Indoor gatherings limited to fewer than 20 individuals.
- Outdoor gatherings limited to fewer than 30 individuals.
- Modified Healthcare services (telemedicine, essential care, chronic care)
- Stop non-essential visits to Pioneer Home, Jail, Youth Center, WISH.



What if you were in contact with a known positive?

If you are being tested because of symptoms or a close contact:

- Stay at home for fourteen (14) days (except to get medical care).
- Avoid all public places and transportation.
- Keep at least 6 feet from people and animals, including those in your household.
- Avoid sharing personal household items, wash your hands and high touch surfaces regularly.
- Inform your work, (or your child’s school) that you are awaiting results.

What if your result is negative?

- **If you are a close contact to a person who is positive and you have tested negative, please follow the health department’s instructions and remain quarantined for at least 14 days since your last contact to the positive case,** because you could still become positive.

What if your result is positive?

Most people do well, but it is important to take care of your health and protect those around you

- Stay at home and avoid all public places and transportation until cleared by public health from isolation (except to get medical care).
- Keep at least 6 feet from people and animals, including those in your household.
- Avoid sharing personal household items (including the restroom), wash your hands and high touch surfaces regularly. • Inform your work (or your child's school) that you are positive.
- Wear a face covering if your symptoms allow, even in the house when not in a separate bedroom.
- Designate one household member to bring you food and other necessities.
- If you need non-medical help (e.g., groceries or other support) call 2-1-1 or 1-800-478-2221.
- Notify your close contacts (i.e., anyone who was within 6 feet of you for 15 minutes or longer during the two days prior to when your symptoms started, or when you were tested, whichever is earlier) that they need to quarantine for 14 days from the time you were last together.
